Nottingham Contemporary art gallery is accessible from all major transport routes. Nottingham Contemporary is right next to the Lace Market Tram Stop, five minutes from Nottingham Railway Station and the Green NCT (Nottingham City Transport) bus routes. And only a few minutes' walk from the city's shops and Broadmarsh Centre.

Nottingham Contemporary is number 26 on the city's ParkSmart Map, in the Lace Market zone. It's one of the country's very easiest galleries to get to. You can't miss the green and gold building opposite the Weekday Cross monument.

Visitors with Disabilities

Nottingham Contemporary is fully accessible for visitors with disabilities from the main entrance at Weekday Cross. The main galleries, Small Collections Room and shop are on street level with access to Café, Bar, Contemporary and The Space via an internal lift.

Access to the Café, Bar, Contemporary for wheelchair users after 7pm is via the Weekday Cross entrance.
